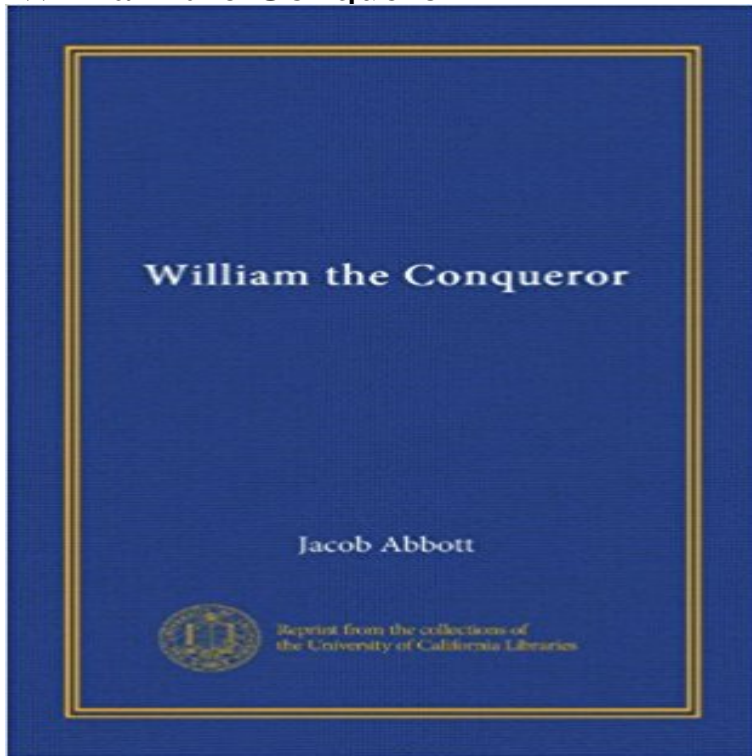


William the Conqueror
