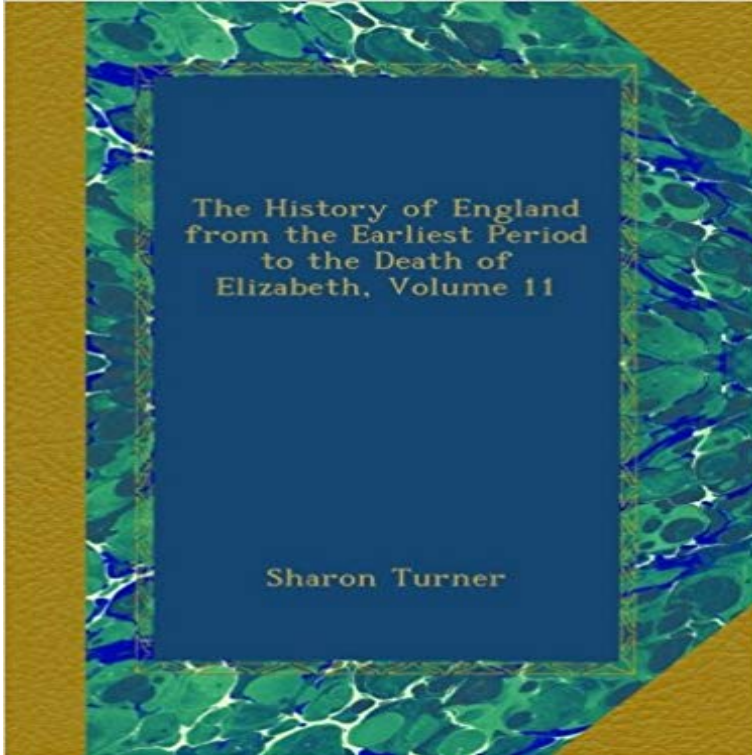


The History of England from the Earliest Period to the Death of Elizabeth, Volume 11
