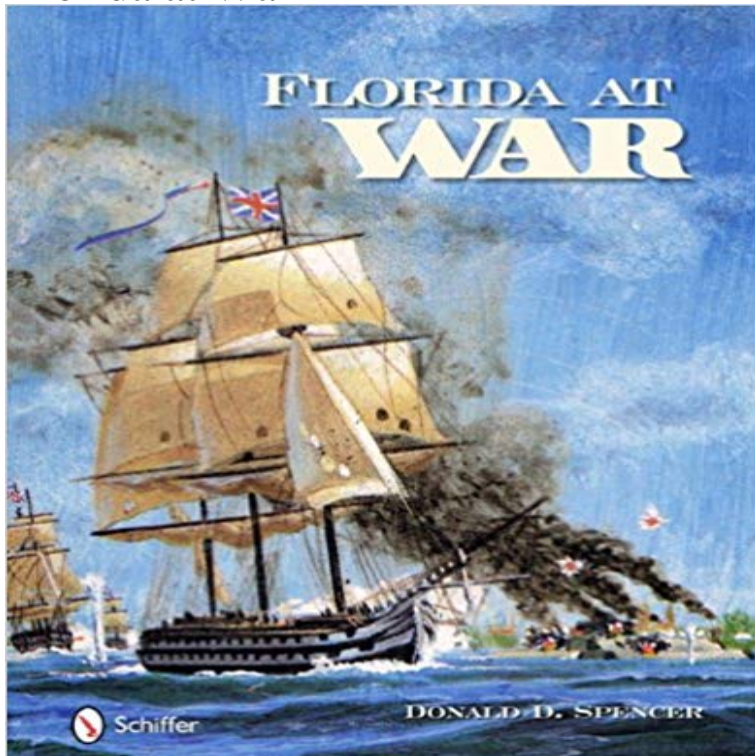


Florida at War
