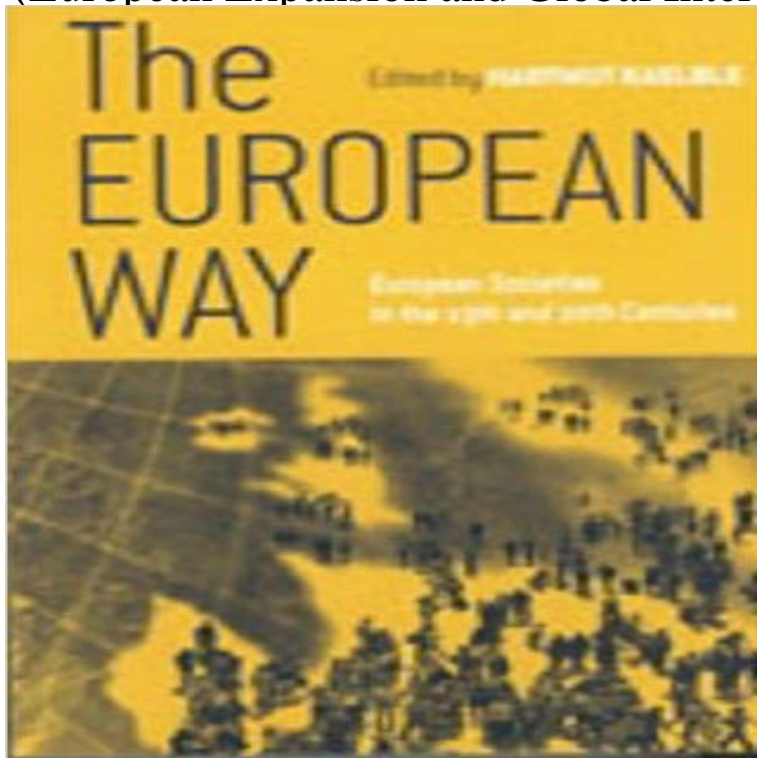


The European Way: European Societies in the 19th and 20th Centuries (European Expansion and Global Interaction)
