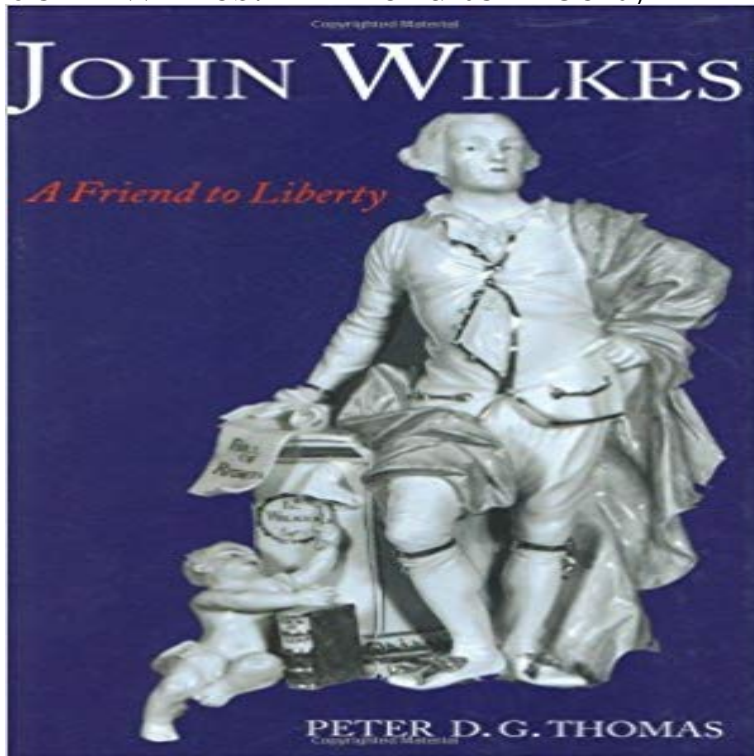


## John Wilkes: A Friend to Liberty
