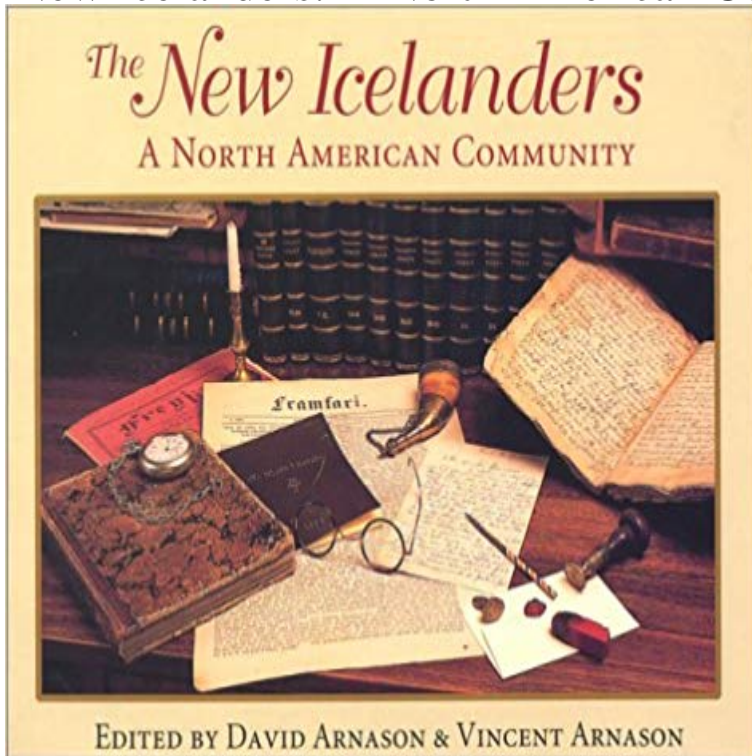


New Icelanders: A North American Community
