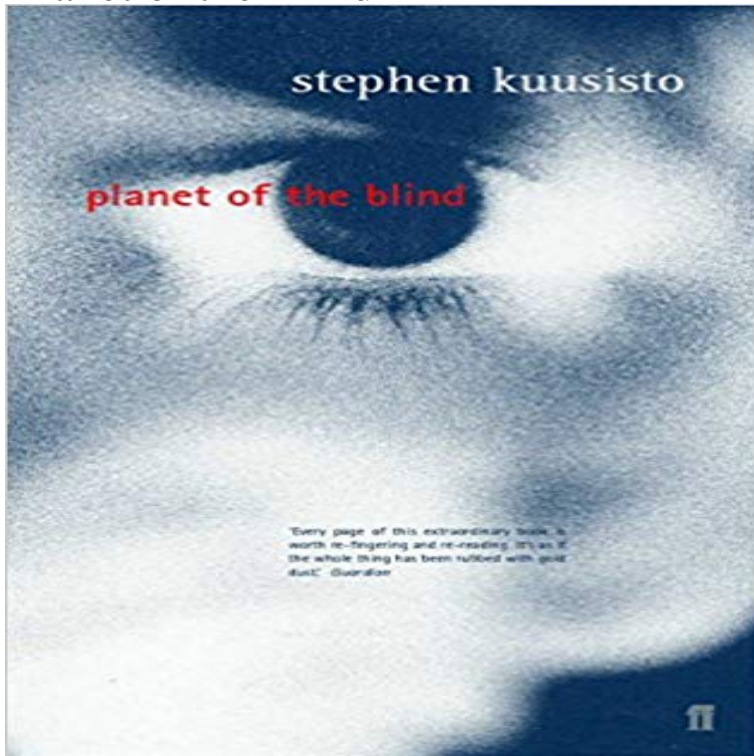


Planet of the Blind

Only when a five-year-old labrador entered his life did he begin to trust, and learn to walk upright.
