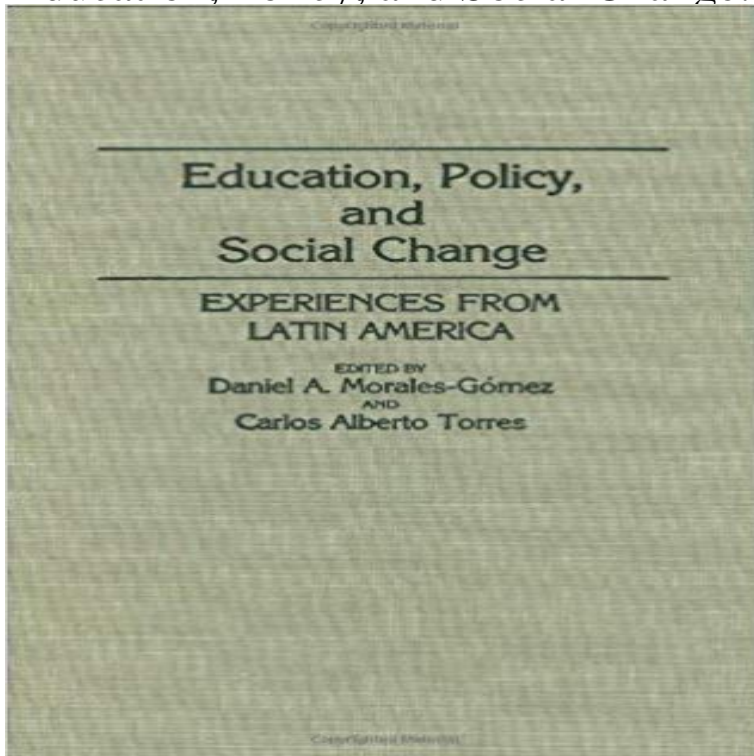


Education, Policy, and Social Change: Experiences from Latin America
