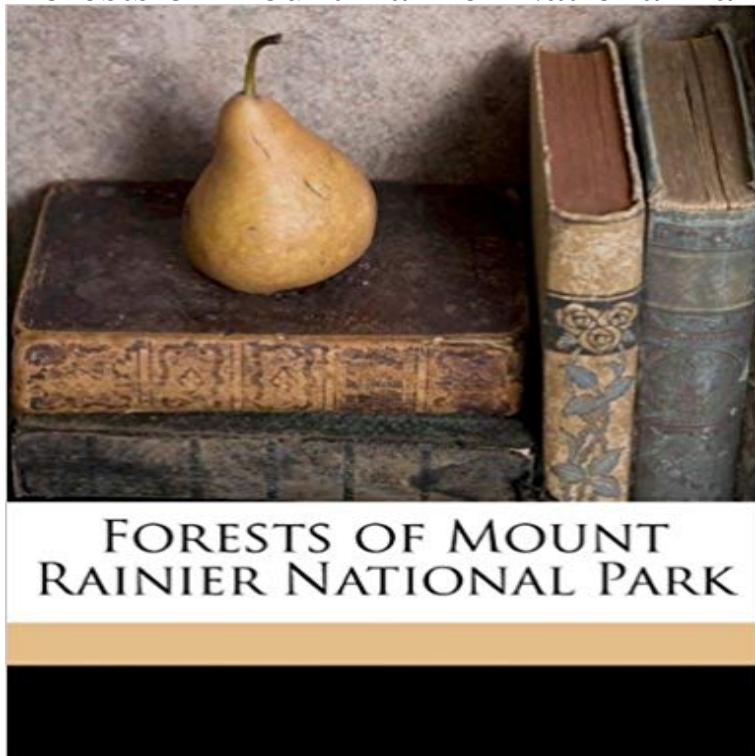


Forests of Mount Rainier National Park
