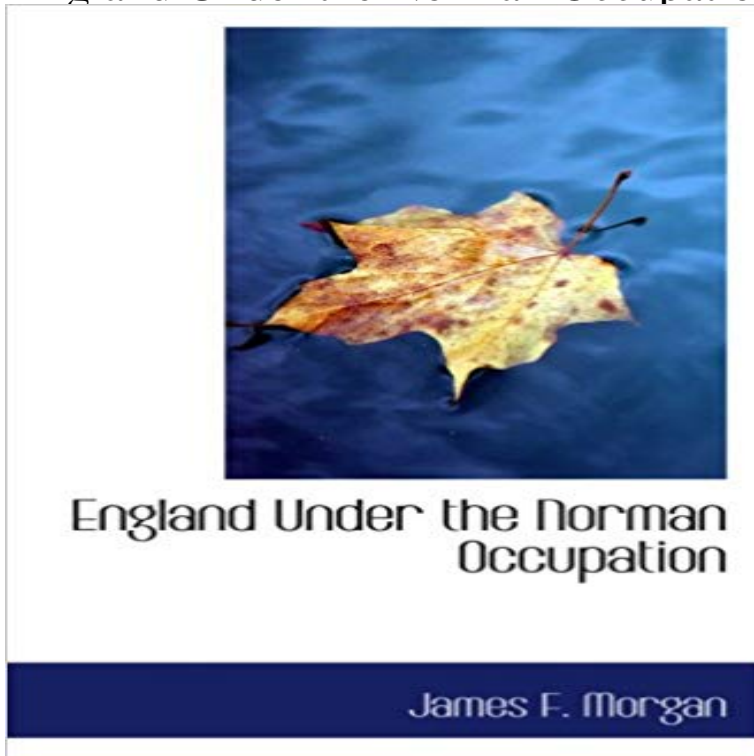


## England Under the Norman Occupation
