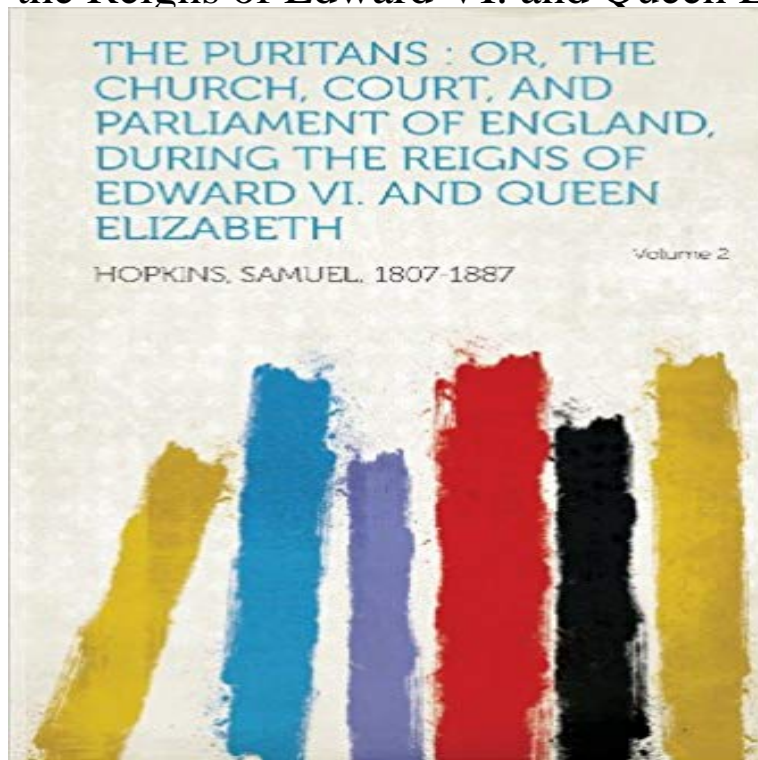


## The Puritans: Or, the Church, Court, and Parliament of England, During the Reigns of Edward VI. and Queen Elizabeth Volume 2
