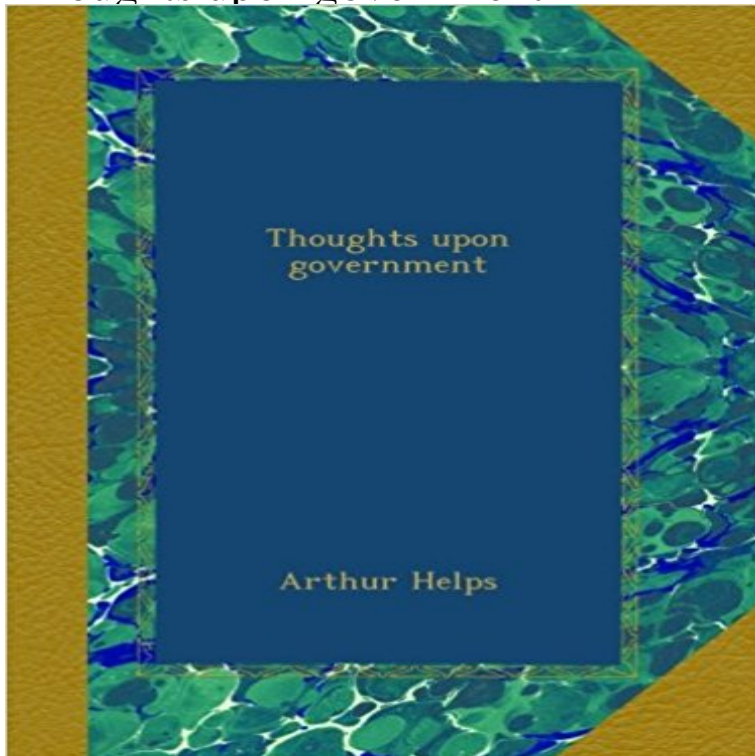


Thoughts upon government
