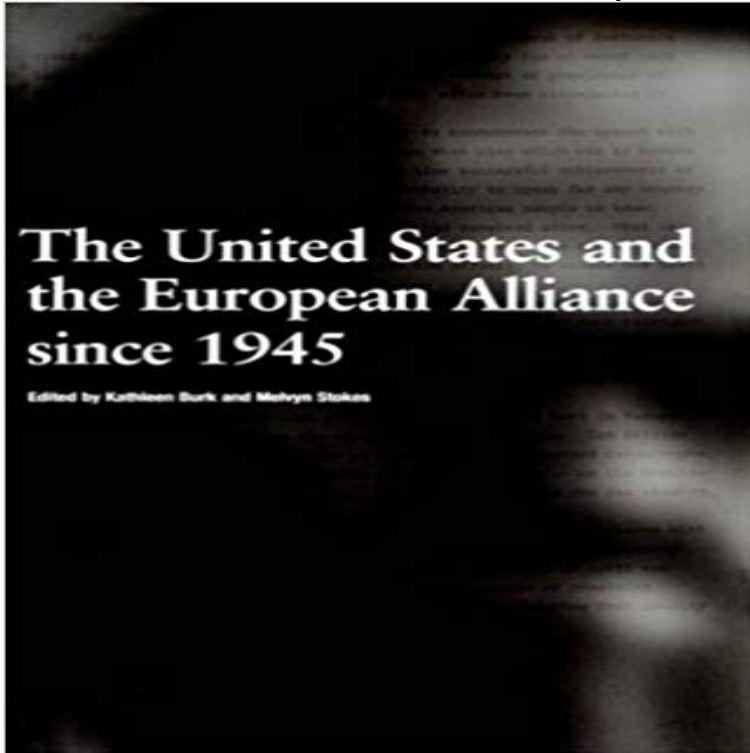


The United States and the European Alliance since 1945
