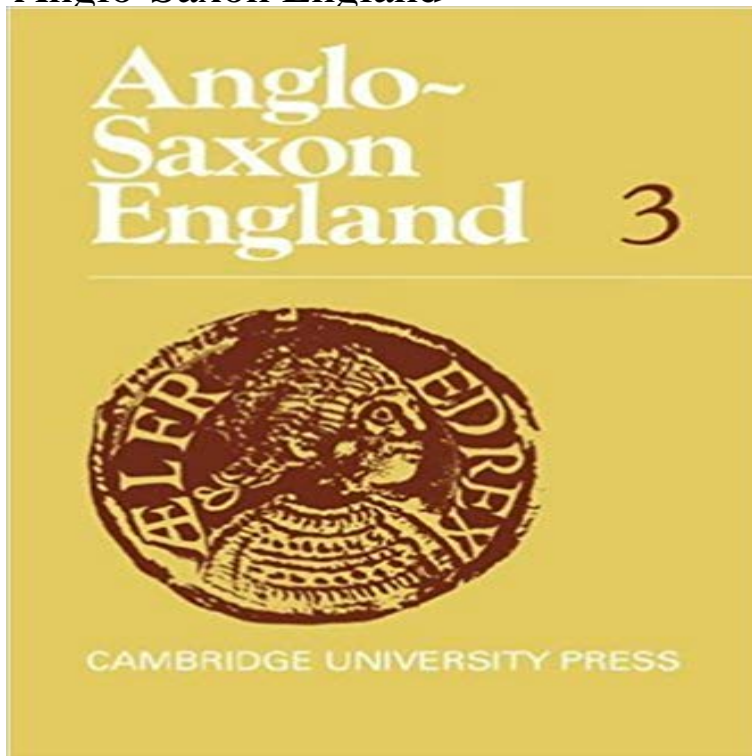


Anglo-Saxon England
