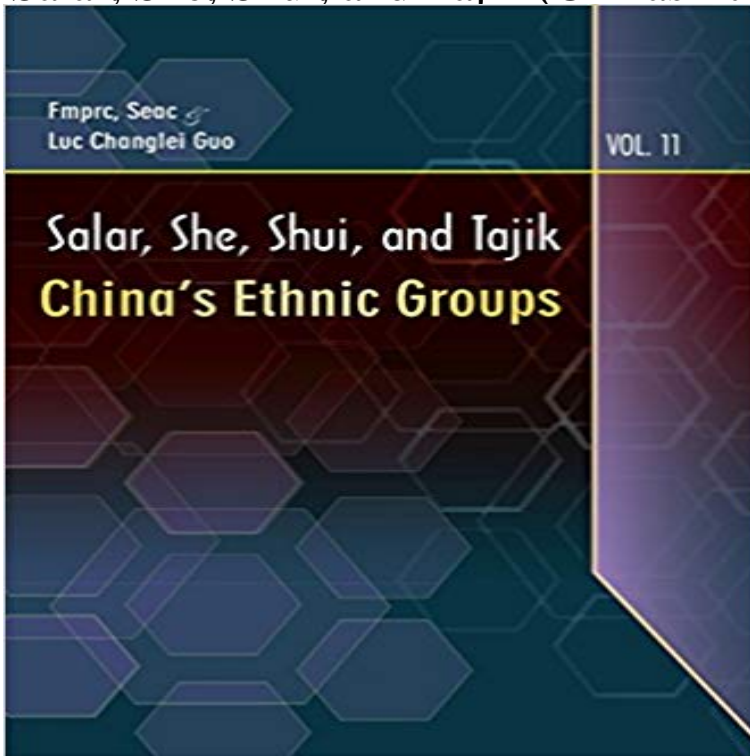


## Salar, She, Shui, and Tajik (Chinas Ethnic Groups) (Volume 11)
