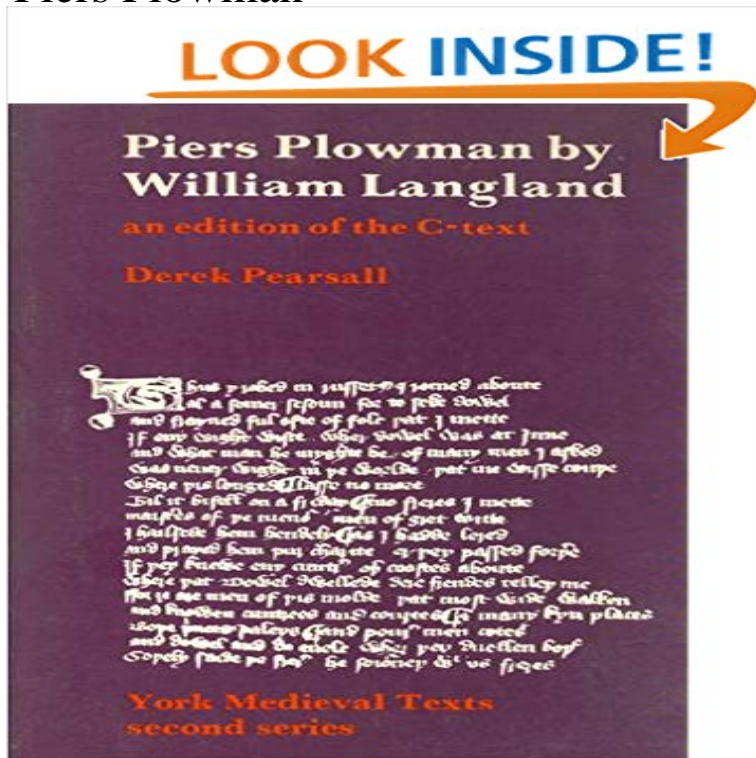


Piers Plowman
