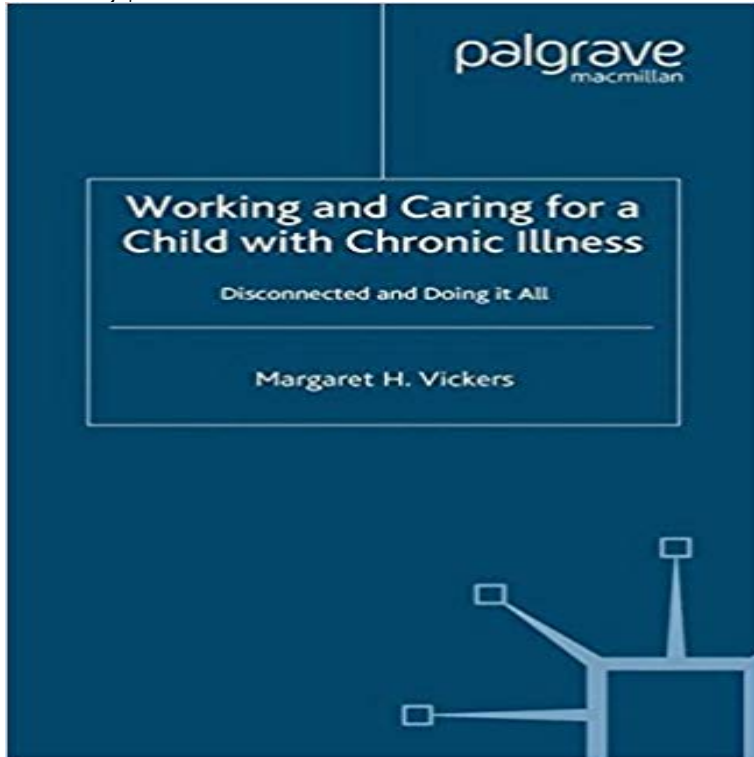


Working and Caring for a Child with Chronic Illness: Disconnected and Doing It All
